Beekeeping Calendar for April – 'Continue comb rotation. Make sure there are enough honey stores or feed your bees. Hives should have at least one full frame of pollen and several frames of honey. If hive is light, feed the bees a 1:1 sugar syrup mixture. Feed pollen supplement if necessary. If the colony is continuing to build up add a honey super every three weeks until June 1 (= 3 deeps or equivalent in westerns = 4-5 deeps of bees by June 1).'
