- Harvard Ribbons had a presentation on using a pollen drawer.
- Pollen is protein for bees. Keep the pollen traps off until the hives are strong. Pollen is what causes people allergies. If you never tried pollen, you should never eat in large amounts (i.e. 1 teaspoon), start with only a few pellets. Many trap drawer designs are out there. Harvard brought a trap that he made himself. If you are capturing pollen, you want to clean out every 3-

4 days to avoid mold issues. Harvard does not install pollen traps until July, and keeps them on the hive for two to three months. Traps cut honey production 10 to 20 percent. A hive can fill out a drawer in one to three days. Always place harvested pollen first in the freezer to destroy aphids, fungi, wax moth etc. Harvard sells his traps for \$50.00 each.
