OBA Survey of Bee Purchases and Installs in 2020

Survey overview

This is a survey about the success of bees introduced locally in 2020 by Olympia Beekeepers Association members and others.

The purposes of this survey are to evaluate:

- 1. Bees purchased in 2020.
- 2. The vendors that supplied bees in 2020.
- 3. The purchasing processes used at OBA to date.
- 4. The success of bees newly introduced in 2020 by means other than purchasing, e.g. own nucs.

Instructions for the survey

What to evaluate:

Include in your survey response(s) the nucs, packages, and queens that you newly installed in 2020, i.e. those that you purchased and any that you newly installed from your own apiary. You are welcome to take this survey even if you did not use OBA's process in your 2020 purchases. Also, your input about the vendors and the purchasing process will still be valuable even if you did not complete a purchase in 2020.

Please use a separate survey form for each distinct purchase, e.g. if you bought from more than vendor you would use a separate form for each vendor; likewise, if you bought both nucs and packages from one vendor. This distinction will help us accurately summarize the responses.
